There are over 500,000 full time teachers in the UK teaching at all ages.

95% of newly qualified teachers are employed within a teaching role in the first 6 months of qualifying.

- **Education isn't just about being a teacher, roles include nursery, youth work and childhood studies.**
- **It is important to gain work experience in this subject to help progress successful learning and secure a job.**
- **To become a teacher, you must complete the Qualified Teacher Status (QTS) which takes approximately one year to complete. You will then become a newly qualified teacher (NQT) and complete a year induction.**
- **You can complete a bachelor in Education, which includes the QTS,**
- **With a degree in education, the world is your oyster as education is a global industry.**
- **Entry requirements vary dependent on which degree you choose, for example to become a primary teacher you will need a GCSE in Science, English and Maths at a grade C/4 or above, as well as the required A Levels.**
