ABOUT US



Next Steps South West (NSSW) is a collaboration of 14 partner universities and colleges throughout Cornwall, Devon, and Somerset, funded by the Office for Students (OfS).

As the region's Uni Connect programme, we help young people navigate their own personal journey to higher education (HE). Throughout the region, we hold events and activities designed to inspire students aged 13-19 years old to fulfil their potential. Together we raise aspirations and awareness, while improving access to HE, helping target students make informed decisions about their future.

To ensure that students receive the right information at the right time, we've created a programme of interventions aimed at developing soft skills and knowledge of educational pathways. Our work is entirely impartial, so students can decide what suits their individual needs.



What is Uni Connect?
The Uni Connect Programme brings together 29 partnerships of universities, further education colleges, and other local partners. The project started in January 2017, and its aim is to double the proportion of young people from disadvantaged backgrounds in HE by 2020.

BARRIERS

Many factors may prevent a young person from fulfilling their future potential. Our events and resources are designed to address the following themes:

SOFT SKILLS

BUILDING SELF-BELIEF AND TRANSFERABLE SKILLS, INCLUDING RESILIENCE, MOTIVATION, TEAM WORK, RESEARCH AND COMMUNICATION.

KNOWLEDGE

PROMOTING UNDERSTANDING OF HE BENEFITS AND CAREER PROSPECTS, STUDY OPTIONS, APPLICATIONS, QUALIFICATION LEVELS AND STUDENT LIFE.

SOCIOECONOMICS

PROVIDING CULTURAL CAPITAL AND ROLE MODELS, WHILST IMPROVING ATTITUDES AND ASPIRATIONS.

FINANCE AND COST

DEVELOPING KNOWLEDGE OF FEES AND FINANCE, SUPPORT AVAILABLE AND BUDGET MANAGEMENT.

INFLUENCERS

INFORMING PERCEPTIONS OF PARENTS AND CARERS.

NSSW OFFER

Progressive and engaging, our core activities are designed in stages that address the NSSW-identified barriers to HE progression.

Introduction Stage - Year 9

- Challenge pre-conceived ideas about HE.
- Provide opportunities to explore the career benefits of HE.
- Introduce HE as a managed, personal investment.
- Inform on local HE provision and provide the opportunity to visit a campus.

Development Stage – Year 10 & 11

- Develop aspirations through interactions with HE role models.
- Use research skills to identify personal interests and possibilities.
- Increase awareness of HE pathways and how HE differs from school.
- Encourage discussion around concerns relating to student fees and finance.

Consolidation Stage – Year 12/13, Post-16 & Adult Learners

- Raise aspirations within subject areas and HE progression routes.
- Develop confidence and ability to make informed HE choices.
- Spend time on HE campuses with student ambassadors and lecturers.
- Understand that finance and geographical location are not barriers to HE progression.

Eligibility Target students are identified as living in a postcode where HE participation is low, or are studying at Level 3 in FE and are 19+. We utilise criteria outlined by the OfS, known as POLAR3 Q1 and Gaps Q1 & Q2.

SUPPORTING HE PROGRESSION

In addition to our activities, schools and colleges can support HE progression in the following ways:

- Include an HE policy statement in your school/college's Careers Policy and publish on your website.
- Encourage progression to HE through your School Development Plan.
- Nominate an HE Advisor, most probably your Careers Leader, who reports to SLT.
- Monitor progression rates to HE at Governing Body level.
- Continue to engage with the NSSW institutional outreach programmes to achieve GB7.
