T Levels? Explained

T Levels have been developed in collaboration with employers and businesses so that the content meets the needs of industry and prepares students for work, further training or study.

- T Levels are 2 year courses after GCSEs
- Alternative to A levels, apprenticeships or other level 3 courses
- Equivalent to 3 A levels
- 315 hour / 45 day industry placement
- 80% classroom / 20% placement
- A T Level Distinction* is worth the same as 3 A levels at A*
- Available to study at selected schools and colleges

Courses currently available:

Building Services Engineering for Construction / Design, Surveying and Planning for Construction / Digital Business Services / Digital Production, Design and Development / Digital Support Services / Education and Childcare / Health / Healthcare Science / Onsite Construction / Science

More subjects are added each year, six more will be added in 2022, and an additional seven in 2023.
